Homeschool Styles

Not recommendations or discouragements and definitely not a complete list. There are as many styles of homeschoolers as there are families.

Traditional:

Structured, similar to doing school at home, follows a very structured curriculum.

Charlotte Mason Style:

Uses living books opposed to structured curriculum. Emphasis on character development and nature studies.

Classical Education:

Structured methodology following the three stages of learning: Grammar stage, Logic stage, and the Rhetoric stage.

Unit Study:

Covers all of the academic subjects through the study of one topic.

Online:

Utilizes a curriculum created by an established virtual school/curriculum publisher.

Unschooling:

Not synonymous with no parental involvement, unschooling follows a child's interests with help from parents and varied supportive resources.

Eclectic:

Highly individualized method, utilizing a variety of homeschooling styles and resources.

Waldorf:

Developmental approach, subjects are not separated from one another, art is always incorporated, and there is a strong emphasis on body, mind, spirit.

Instill and Protect a love of learning.
